GRADES

Report cards are available at the end of each quarter. Grades of 70 and above are passing; grades of 69 and below are failing. Semester grades are comprised of 40% for first and second quarter grades, plus 20% for semester exam grade. Semester grades are calculated on a 100-point scale

Eight points will be added to each semester grade in Honors, Pre-AP, Advanced Placement, and Dual Credit courses when computing grades. Students must earn a 70 or higher in order to receive eight points on their semester grade.
