Please wear closed-toe shoes.



DISTRICT CHAMPIONS AND COACH OF THE YEAR

Nolan Catholic Cross Country teams swept the TAPPS District 1 Regional meet yesterday, October 21 at Norbuck Park in Dallas, Texas. The weather and course provided ideal conditions for a number of our athletes to run personal bests and make the All-District Team Top 10.

For the second year in a row, Coach Keith Kotar was named Coach of the Year for both the boys and girls teams. Both teams will travel to the State meet on November 1 in Waco, Texas.

BACK-TO-BACK TEAM TENNIS TAPPS STATE CHAMPIONS

Nolan Catholic High School won the TAPPS Division 1 Team Tennis Championships on Tuesday, October 19, in Waco, Texas. Overall, the Vikings posted a 27-6 record across all matches of the two-day tournament.

Coach Chi Nguyen had this to say following the tournament, "I am very proud and love each and every one of my players individually and collectively as a team. Our best male player graduated last year, and our best female player could not play due to an ACL injury. They have been brewed in blood, sweat, and tears since the day they joined the team. They have grown together and supported each other as a family. We played some outstanding teams, and they played their hearts out these past two days and deserved every bit of the credit.

The players are taught to do their best, never give up, and have fun in the process. They are taught to fight for one point at a time, and that is their "dub." Winning the tournament is a bonus, and back-to-back championships are just a blessing from above."

The NCHS tennis program has now claimed back-to-back TAPPS team state championships.
